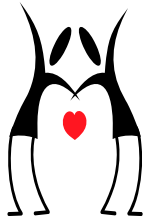

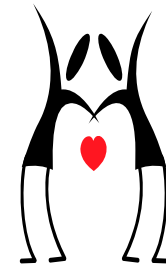

alley's house accomplishes this mission through the *Building Brighter Tomorrows* workshops and the *Mentors for Young Mothers* Program.

Become a Mentor and Change a Life!

alley's house is a member of the Metroplex Mentor Center formed by Big Brothers Big Sisters and the Volunteer Centers of Dallas, Arlington, and Fort Worth. The Center is a coalition of agencies who meet certain standards in their mentoring programs. Potential volunteer mentors receive information about our program through this Center.

What is a Mentor?

A mentor is defined as a trusted and faithful individual who listens, supports and guides on a consistent basis over a defined period of time.



Mentors for Young Mothers Program

Eligibility Criteria

- ◆ Must be female over the age of 21.
- ◆ Must be willing to volunteer a minimum of 6 hours per month for a one year period.
- ◆ Must have stable work and personal history (at least one year at work and at residence).
- ◆ Must agree to a Criminal Background and references check.

Facts About Teen Mothers

- ◆ 40,000 U.S. teen girls drop out of school each year due to pregnancy.
- ◆ 50,000 new teen mothers in Texas every year.
- ◆ 83% of daughters of teen mothers will become a teen mother themselves.



Steps to Becoming a Mentor



- ◆ Call 214.915.9945 to request a Mentor information packet.
- ◆ Complete and mail the necessary forms to 4907 Spring Ave., Suite 103, Dallas, TX 75210 or fax to 214.915.9947.
- ◆ The Program Director will process your references and Criminal Background Check.
- ◆ Upon approval, the Program Director will call you to schedule a Mentor Orientation and Training Workshops.
- ◆ Attend the Orientation and Training workshops.
- ◆ The Program Director will contact you to schedule your Personal Interview.
- ◆ Once you've been approved as a Mentor, the matching process begins.
- ◆ Once a match has been made, the Program Director will contact you for a first meeting with your teen mother!
- ◆ Future visits with your teen mom are scheduled weekly or biweekly as schedules permit.
